leaving hospitals struggling to cope and oxygen in short supply resulting in casualties.

The latter, with assistance from Caritas Germany and Siemens Caring Hands, extended help providing by 25 **Oxygen Concentrators** with accessories. identified BDSSS Belgaum Institute of Medical Sciences as its donee hospital.
